

Summary of HIPAA Notice of Privacy Practices

Moore Express Urgent Care complies with the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996 (HIPAA). We protect confidential health care information, known as "Protected Health Information" (PHI). Below is a summary of your privacy rights under HIPAA. Our legal duties and privacy practices regarding your PHI are also included in this Summary Notice.

Summary of Your Privacy Rights

Moore Express Urgent Care may use and give your health information to:

- Treat you
- Get paid
- Refer you to a specialist

Moore Express Urgent Care may use and give your health information for:

- Law enforcement requests
- Judicial and administrative proceedings related to legal actions
- Healthcare fraud and abuse detection or compliance with the law
- Use by another healthcare provider treating you
- Government health oversight activities
- Reports required by law related to births, deaths or diseases
- Reports required by law related to neglect and abuse, or domestic violence
- Notifying a party about exposure to a possible communicable disease
- Use by another healthcare provider for payment to that provider
- Military, national defense and security or other governmental functions
- Workers' compensation purposes and in compliance with related laws
- Averting a serious threat to public health and safety

You have the right to:

- Inspect or get a copy of your medical record
- Change information on your medical record if you think it is incorrect
- Get a list of persons with whom Moore Express Urgent Care shared your PHI
- Ask Moore Express Urgent Care to limit the information it shares
- Ask for a copy of your privacy notice
- Write a letter of complaint to Moore Express Urgent Care or the federal government
